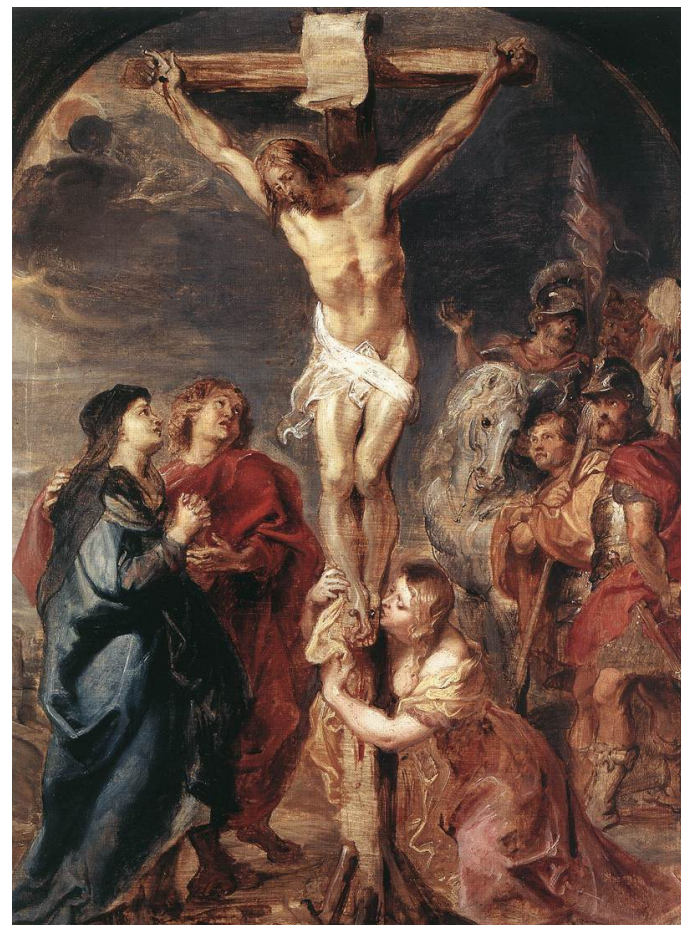

How infinitely rich is God's mercy!

"The heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity." And God's response is to "tirelessly send them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people" - a compassion too often taken for granted. The people "prefer darkness to the light" and were taken into captivity in Babylon. Desolate in their exile, they experienced "how infinitely rich he is in grace" through a refusal to forget God. Those who are dead in their transgressions are who remember that God is "generous with his mercy" bear sure hope to be brought to life with Christ.
