

The Feast of Saint Peter & Saint Paul

Among the twelve apostles, Peter became the spokesman, as when he boldly declared: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." In the lists of the apostles, he is always given precedence, and at Pentecost, he delivers the first fiery sermon of the infant church. Although not one of the Twelve, Paul is also called an apostle. By his own admission, he was the apostle "born when no one expected it" (I Cor. 15:8), having encountered the resurrected Jesus as he rode to persecute the Christians of Damascus. Paul's mission field was the vast Gentile territory in the eastern Mediterranean. According to ancient tradition, the liturgy celebrates Peter and Paul together, commemorating their glorious martyrdom on the same day. They both sealed with their blood the witness they bore to Christ by their preaching and ministry in the early church. Both men were martyred in Rome around the year 64.

We plan on continuing to live stream our Sunday Eucharist at 10 a.m. on our website for the coming months. We pray that this ministry will not only be a blessing for those parishioners not able to join us in person, but that it will also continue to reach beyond our parish to bring good news to a wider 'virtual' congregation.
