

The fickle crowds

Worldly glory is fleeting. Christ enters into Jerusalem to the tune of crowds chanting, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Only five days later, the same crowd cries "Crucify him! Crucify him!" How their fickleness contrasts with Jesus' constancy, for he remains faithful, humble, "even to accepting death, death on a cross." Despite beatings, insults, and spitting, Jesus knows full well that he will "not be shamed." United to him, neither will we, for it is in his Passion that we find the forgiveness of our sins and the strength to rise above persecution, injustice, and suffering.

Yellow Phase Regulations

During the yellow phase of the GNB's recovery plan, we are permitted to gather at St. Paul's with 2m distancing. There is no cap on the number - we are limited only by our physical space. It is possible in this phase to have congregational singing with masking.
