

God says to Solomon, "ask what you would like me to give you." "It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked" for an understanding heart rather than long life or riches. Solomon's heart is like that of the man who sells all he owns in order to buy the field where the treasure is buried. The desire of Solomon is like that of the merchant who risks his whole livelihood in order to acquire a very fine pearl. Such sacrifices can be made only because of the certainty that this treasure, this pearl of great price, corresponds to the deepest longing of a "discerning" heart: the longing for Christ himself.

Stewardship Reflection

"We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28) Do you really trust God?
