

Sinking Deep Roots

In the marvelous and inexhaustibly rich parable of the sower, we hear that some of the seed fell upon rocky ground and grew at once but soon withered because of lack of roots. Sometimes people hear the Word of God and receive it with joy, even enthusiasm, but because they do not allow that Word to sink deep down into their hearts, their faith fades quickly enough. Almost everyone goes through a "religious phase," a time when they find God and the things of God fascinating. But frequently they do not cultivate this interest, grounding it in practice, prayer, and daily devotion. Those are precisely the means by which the Word grounds itself in us. But the difficulty is that these actions are not particularly glamorous. To pray every day, whether one feels like it or not; to care for the sick, even when they are fussy and ungrateful; to attend Mass every Sunday, even when the priests give mediocre homilies and the choir needs a lot of work - this is how we sink deep and abiding roots.
