Merry Christmas & Welcome to St. Paul's!

We are pleased you have joined us for this Eucharist. In it we recall the last meal of Christ with his friends in the Upper Room, and we recognise him in the breaking of the bread. Although our faith is grounded in history, this service is not a nostalgic looking back to the events of the past: it is a celebration that in the Eucharist Christ is truly present to us now, and a promise of the glory that will be ours when the whole universe is made complete in him. The season of Christmas is a time of great joy, as we hear again the message of the angels, and go in heart and mind to Bethlehem to see the babe lying in a manger. The mood is one of wonder that God has sent his Son into the world to share our life, and that he comes to us in this service in bread and wine. All baptized Christians from any Christian tradition are warmly invited to receive communion at this service.

We wish you a joyful and peaceful Christmas, and pray that you will know the presence of the incarnate Christ in your hearts and lives.

St. Paul's COVID-19 Regulations

We have made every effort to ensure St. Paul's is safe for everyone! You may have noticed some things are a little different.

- 1. You must wear a mask at all times (children 2 and under and those with health conditions preventing the use of a mask are exempted).
- 2. Please proceed to your pew directly and refrain from moving around the church unnecessarily.
- 3. Be careful to maintain 2m of distance between you and other worshipers.
- 4. Holy Communion is being offered in one kind only (the host). The chalice is not being offered at this time. The church's doctrine of concomitance states that we receive the fullness of the sacrament even if we can receive in just one kind.
- 4. Please depart via the lobby doors, maintaining proper 2m distancing. If you would like to stop and chat with other worshipers, we ask that you move outside so as not to halt the flow of traffic.
